

If your child has a genetic cause of short stature in one of the following 5 categories, a medicine called vosoritide may help your child grow taller. Hypochondroplasia, CNP Deficiency, Heterozygous NPR2 mutations, Rasopathies, and SHOX mutations

Vosoritide for Selected Genetic Causes of Short Stature is a clinical research study testing an experimental medication. Researchers are studying the safety of vosoritide in children in these 5 categories to see whether it can help them grow better. Vosoritide is given as a small shot under the skin once per day. If your child qualifies and agrees to take part in this research study at Children's National Hospital, they will receive the medicine used in this study at no cost to you. Participants will be reimbursed for study-related travel expenses.

Participants will come to Children's National for a total of 4 visits over 18 months.

For participants' first 6 months of the study, their growth will be observed. For participants' last 12 months of the study, they will receive the study medication, vosoritide.
